*Students' association donation will create \$250K in scholarships*

**February 4, 2009** – The Palliser Students' Association (PSA) has announced a major contribution to student scholarships at SIAST Palliser Campus. Over the next 10 years, the PSA will support student scholarships and awards that, through a matching funds program, will have a total value of approximately \$250,000.

"With the ongoing support of Coca-Cola, the Palliser Students' Association will continue to support scholarships, awards and initiatives that will improve the quality of student life at the Palliser campus," Mike Ehr, president of the PSA said. "We felt that with the increasing enrolment at SIAST Palliser Campus, there was a need to increase the number of scholarships and awards available to students.
